Session Highlights

Church Information Form:

With a few exceptions, regular business was suspended so that Session could review the draft Church Information Form submitted by the Pastor Nominating Committee. This document has to be approved by Session and the Committee on Ministry before it is posted on the Presbytery web page for pastors who are interested in pastoral openings. Once posted, the PNC will begin getting applications. Butch Kleyweg, acting on behalf of the PNC, led the review. Several items were discussed and some revisions were agreed upon which Butch will take back to the PNC for use in developing its next draft. Session plans to hold another meeting August 28th to review the revised document with the expectation that it can be approved at that time. If this occurs, the document can then be submitted for approval by the COM in time for its next meeting.

Nominating Committee Meeting:

Session designated Chuck Smothermon as its nominee for Chairperson of the Nominating Committee to develop a slate of candidates for elders and deacons with terms commencing 2013. Chuck will recruit two more members for Session's consideration at the next regular meeting. At that time, Session will establish a formal slate and set a Congregational meeting date to vote on the nominating committee.

"....An Elder shares...".

Psalm 14:1, "The fool says in his heart, 'There is no God'". Dinesh D'Souza, public intellectual, author, and Christian apologist who is currently the President of The King's College in New York City, using science, philosophy and human experience, demonstrates the timelessness of God's Holy Word. In his book, <u>Life after Death, The Evidence</u>, he takes on today's celebrity atheists who insist that we are material beings, nothing more, and once our material bodies cease - that is it - there is nothing more. According to them, those who believe otherwise are irrational, ignoring the clear implications of modern science and clinging to outmoded religious superstitions.

D'Souza takes his readers deeper into the very premises on which the materialists base their conclusions and washes away the foundations on which modern, outspoken, sophisticated atheists in academia and the media build their criticism of believers in an afterlife and the supernatural. Personally, I am struck by the breadth of D'Souza's comprehension of the latest developments in science along with history, philosophy and religion and his ability to syntheses them concisely and understandably. You do not have to be a rocket scientist to follow him when he covers developments in brain science and attempts to establish consciousness as a function of deterministic materialism, quantum mechanics and cosmology. He covers the formulation of life after death among the various religions and even examines "near death experiences". I was particularly interested in his section on philosophy; wherein, he explains Kant, Shopenhouer, Hume and Berkley. Kant, considered the greatest of Western modern philosophers, established a rational foundation for another realm beyond the physical realm of which we are aware - a foundation on which the others built. The rationale has never been disproved. D'Souza then covers the experience of the only one to ever arise from the dead unto eternal life - Jesus Christ - and how believing this as a historical event, is no more irrational than believing Genghis Kahn invaded China.

This is not a text book. It is very readable. If you read it, the next time someone cites Hitchens, Dennet, Dawkins or Harris as authorative you can say "They are fools" and have the evidence to prove it.
