While we celebrate our nation's independence, it's worthwhile looking at how far we have come as a nation. Here are some funny parts of our nation's history:

- In the early years, anyone who bathed more than once in Philadelphia faced a jail-term because it was believed that bathing led to sin.
 - In 1782, Congress considered the eagle to be the symbol for the Seal of the country. However, Benjamin Franklin disagreed. Writing to his daughter, he said: "The bald eagle is a bird of bad moral character and does not get its living honestly."

Benjamin Franklin accused the eagle of liking to perch on dead trees and that it was too lazy to fish for itself; it watches the labor of the fishing hawk and then steals the hawk's catch. Benjamin Franklin wanted the turkey to be the symbol of America.

Now, on a more serious note. I want to share how the Bible played an important part in making our country great:

- The Bible was the Book which formed the documents that framed and formed our government.
 - It was the government which founded and printed the first English Bible. In fact, the Continental Congress was dubbed "The Bible Congress" by the media.

- John Jay, who was the <u>first</u> Supreme Court Chief Justice, became the third president of the American Bible Society.
