Pastor's Weekly Devotional- September 10, 2015

"Matters of the Heart"

Biblically, the term "heart" represents our whole inner being. The Greek word for "heart" is KARDIA, from which we form such words as <u>cardiology</u>. Here is a brief explanation of the "heart" according to the Bible:

The heart is the center of the inner life of a person and the source or seat of all the focus and functions of soul and spirit...The heart is supremely the one center in a person to which God turns, in which the religious life is rooted, which determines <u>moral conduct</u>.

The bible describes various kinds of hearts. Some are Evil and some are Good.

A Cunning Heart	A Righteous Heart
A Scheming Heart	A Pure Heart
A Deceptive Heart	A Glad Heart
A Haughty Heart	A Tranquil Heart
An Envious Heart	A Wise Heart

What is it that determines the kind of heart we all have?

<u>First</u>, OUR THOUGHTS. "As a person thinks so is he" (<u>Proverbs</u> 23:7a). It all begins with the seed thoughts we allow to flourish in our minds.

<u>Second</u>, OUR SPEECH. "Death and life are in the power of the tongue" (<u>Proverbs</u> 18:21a).

<u>Third</u>, OUR MONEY. "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (<u>Luke</u> 12:34). Read your expenditures, you'll likely find where your treasure is buried (on what you spent).

The heart is where the Holy Spirit communicates truth. So guard it. Preserve it. Nothing more sacred belongs to you than your heart. Keep watch over it well. Then ask yourself: "What kind of heart do I really have?"
