The football coach had reached the point of exasperation. "Losing five games in a row is bad enough. But what really frustrates one is that we keep making the same mistakes over and over. We just aren't learning anything!"

What causes the most pain is not the initial loss but the failure to learn anything in the process. This reminds me of a teacher who complained to his administrator: "I have 25 years of experience." The administrator's response was both candid and penetrating. "No, you don't have 25 years of experience. You have one year of experience twenty-five times." The teacher did not learn from his mistakes along the way.

This is the way real life works! We do not learn the great lessons of life in times of ease and prosperity. The greatest character-building and faith-strengthening lessons come during times of difficulty and heartache.
