Good Samaritan Mission is a volunteer driven ministry that was established for the purpose of proclaiming the love and compassion of Christ and the good news of his salvation to the poor, hungry, addicted and wounded of N.W. Indiana.

The ministry is volunteer driven to provide a venue for the members of local churches to have an opportunity to strengthen their faith by putting into practice the teachings of Scripture concerning ministry to the poor and forgotten.

The purpose of Good Samaritan Mission Ministries is to provide Christian hope and opportunity to broken men, women and children that suffer from homelessness, addictions, hunger and poverty.

Our New Soup Kitchen

Our new soup kitchen is now open. We are serving hot, nutritious meals to the homeless, single moms and their children and the poor out of three locations. Our central kitchen is located at the corner of Grant and 13th Avenue in Gary.



In addition to Grant Street, we are also serving on 41st Avenue off of Broadway and 5th Avenue on the West Side of Gary. By making these changes, we have been able to reduce our fixed costs by over 50%.

From our central kitchen located on Grant Street, hot food is prepared and transported to two different churches in Gary. This facilitates a relationship between the person needing food and the church and community volunteers. We also serve meals at our central kitchen. The goals of this program are to feed men and women that are hungry, recruit the homeless and those addicted to drugs and alcohol for our LifeChange programs and connect people to the ministries of local churches.
